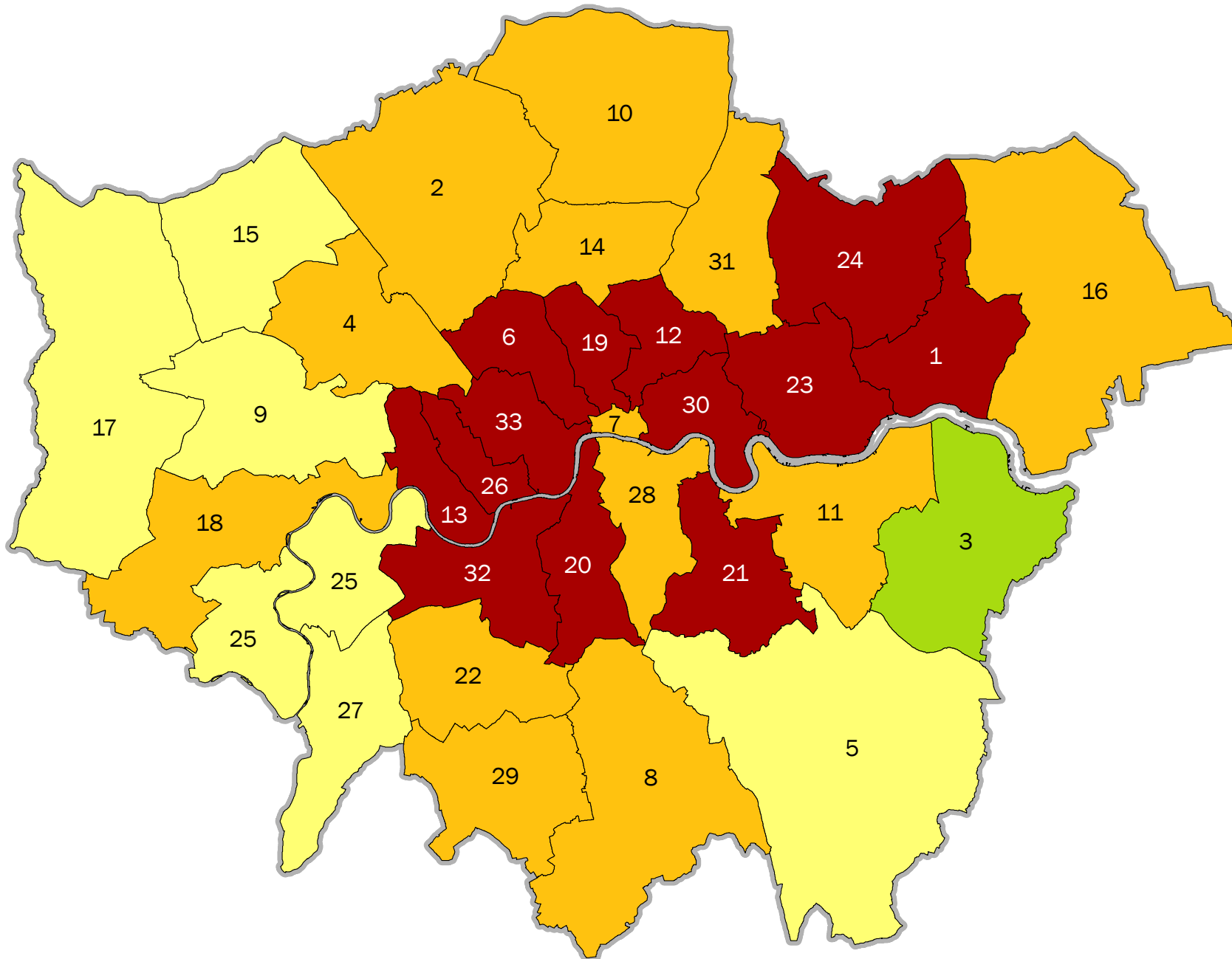
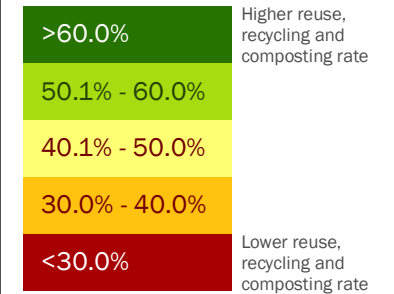


% of household waste sent for reuse, recycling or composting, 2015-2016 by local authority area for London
